Roland "Rolly" Dale Miller passed away peacefully at the Willow Glen Center in San Jose on March 22, 2016. After being diagnosed with Alzheimer's two years ago, the disease slowly progressed to the point where he had to be hospitalized and ultimately transferred to the rehabilitation center in Willow Glen. Rolly was 85.

The oldest of six children, Rolly was born on June 7, 1930 to Roland (Sr.) and Lillian Miller in Seattle, WA, but he grew up in Spokane with his five younger siblings. He joined the U.S. Army after high school and served from 1952 to 1954 as a military policeman at Camp Desert Rock near Las Vegas during tests of the atomic bomb. Following his military service, Rolly attended San Jose State and, in 1956, joined the San Jose Police Department which led to a 31-year career, first as a police officer, then as a police sergeant. During the first 16 years of his career he was assigned to the Traffic Enforcement Unit as a motorcycle policeman as an officer and sergeant. In that capacity, Rolly trained new motorcycle officers, taught police classes at San Jose City College, and served as president of the Municipal Motorcycle Officers of California (MMOC). He also was a member of the San Jose Police Officers' Assn. and the San Jose Police Benevolent Assn. His remaining time on the Police Department was spent as a Patrol sergeant and Burglary Detective.

Rolly enjoyed hunting for deer, fishing and camping, but spending time with his family and grandkids was his first love.

Rolly is survived by his wife, Toni; a son, Steve Miller; daughter Holly Miller Luscher and her husband, Lee; grandsons Logan and Landon Luscher, and three children from his first marriage: Mike Miller, Debbie Miller and Valerie Miller Talley. Rolly also is survived by siblings Roy Miller, Evelyn Miller and Francis Miller. The remaining two, Don Miller and Jacqueline Miller, are deceased.

Rolly and Toni celebrated their 49th wedding anniversary on Feb. 27, 2016.

AG Loretta Lynch Wants to Let Nation Break Law Without Consequences

As New York moves to decriminalize low-level offenses, arguing enforcement is "rigged against communities of color," other large cities are coming under pressure from the Justice Department to do the same thing.

Attorney General Loretta Lynch has issued a warning to municipal and state judges across the country that their courts could lose federal funding if they don't ease up on fines and arrest warrants for minor crimes involving poor offenders, indigent minorities in particular.

In lieu of fines and jail time, Lynch urges the nation's 6,500 municipal courts to provide an avenue for offenders to perform "community service" or take advantage of "amnesty days," whereby outstanding arrest warrants are cleared for nominal fees.

That's the world we can and must build together."

Zuckerberg said that terror attacks in recent months "all had a common thread: they were carried out with a goal to spread fear and distrust, and turn members of a community against each other."

AL MUZAHIMIYAH, SAUDI ARABIA—Complaining that he must have "tweaked it pretty good," Saudi executioner Khalid al-Faraj told reporters Thursday that he thinks he pulled something in his shoulder during yesterday's last 10 decapitations. "Around the seventh or eighth beheading I came around kind of awkwardly on my windup and heard this loud pop, and I knew immediately that something wasn't right, " said al-Faraj, adding that he attempted to ignore the dull pain spreading through his upper right arm and power through the rest of the executions, but he barely had enough strength left to make a clean slice on the final prisoner.
