It was a long day for Dave, but being the trooper that he is, he hung in there for the entire process. He was pretty tired when he got home, but by Saturday you could tell that the fabulous little machine was working. He seemed to rest better at night and also has more energy. I would say that he is more alert, and his voice is stronger. The physical and occupational therapists are working him hard, teaching him how to do things like stand up from a seated position by himself, and he is using his walker pretty much with no help. While he was originally relegated to walking in the house, he is now able to take short jaunts around the long court he lives on. I'm impressed with his drive and determination. His Parkinson's medications have been cut in half because of the procedure, too.**

**Dave and Betty Ruth really appreciate the outpouring of support they have received, both financial and just for being there for them. He has received enough cards and letters to open his own Hallmark store. You can tell that he and Betty Ruth are really loved! It is a real tribute to a man who has given so much of himself to the SJPB family for so many years. My eyes well up with tears as I write this, thinking of all the people who have been so generous and supportive of Dave and Betty Ruth.**

**Dave can have visitors, but Betty Ruth asks that we call first as his therapy schedule changes from day-to-day. He loves hearing from everyone, and relishes the opportunities he has to talk to his PD family on the phone. I love to hear him talk to someone, and ask them about their family members by name. I doubt that I could do that. He has a lot of good memories from his time with the PD, so do share those**

**"Remember when?" stories. He loves that. If you do come by, feel free to challenge Dave to a game. He likes cards and dominoes, and I just delivered Farkle over there today. He watched Betty Ruth play it one time about four years ago, but something tells me that Dave is going to be the Farkle champ in no time!**

**Chaplain Jim was over this afternoon, and invited Dave to come to the "End of Shift BBQ" tomorrow. If he is feeling good in the morning, I am sure we will be taking a drive down to the PD for lunch. He is also planning to attend the PBA membership meeting next week. I will be coming with him. Are they still meeting at Bini's? That's how long it's been since I was last there!**

#### **Flood of Support for Retired S.J. Police Chaplain**

**Many readers will recall the story of Dave Bridgen, the beloved San Jose police chaplain who retired last year after 28 years on the job.**

**He helped scores of officers through some of the toughest times imaginable, and now those officers — and many others — are rallying to his side.**

**Bridgen has Parkinson's disease and underwent brain surgery in early August at Stanford Medical Center, a procedure to treat some of the disease's debilitating motor symptoms. The surgery went as planned but the recovery — expected to be only two or three days — lasted nearly two weeks.**

**And he was sent home because Medicare wouldn't cover the extra time his doctors recommended.**

**The costs of in-home care and necessary modifications to his house are adding up**

beyond the means of Bridgen and his wife, Betty Ruth.

So the San Jose Police Officers Association set up a campaign at HealthDonor.com ([www.healthdonor.com/campaigns/chaplaindavefund](http://www.healthdonor.com/campaigns/chaplaindavefund)) with the goal of raising \$25,000 in 51 days.

A "call to action" email went out about the campaign just after 2 p.m. Tuesday. Within half an hour, 40 donors had contributed a total of \$7,000.

By 4 p.m. Tuesday, it had hit \$10,000 and by Thursday morning, it had soared past its goal to more than \$26,000. "It appears that the 51 Days' goal to raise the requested funds is going to get blown out of the water, and it's extremely heartwarming to me to see that a man who has given so much to so many over so many years is receiving such solid support," former San Jose Police Chief Rob Davis said Tuesday afternoon. "I personally cannot think of anyone at San Jose P.D. who deserves such a response more than Dave Bridgen."

### **Sheriff's Office Needs Independent Oversight**

**On Aug. 27, Michael Tyree, an inmate in the Santa Clara County Jail, was found dead in his cell.**

**Three correctional officers — Jereh Lubrin, Matthew Farris and Rafael Rodriguez — have been charged with murder.**

**Sheriff Laurie Smith has acted swiftly to condemn the killing and to cooperate with the district attorney and the FBI.**

**Her acts, while commendable, are not enough.**

**She should now call for the creation of an agency to provide independent oversight of allegations of misconduct of all officers under the sheriff's command: deputies who patrol our streets, and correctional officers who guard jail inmates, many of whom, like Tyree, are mentally ill. In 1996, the voters of San Jose amended the city's charter to create the Office of the Independent Police Auditor. The primary mission of this office is to provide oversight of investigations into the public's allegations of San Jose police officer misconduct.**

**The Board of Supervisors of Santa Clara County should do the same by establishing independent civilian oversight of the sheriff's office.**

**The Department of Correction (DOC), the fifth largest jail system in California, falls under the jurisdiction of the sheriff. It houses and guards more than 4,000 inmates each day. How many inmates annually lodge complaints against correctional deputies? How are these complaints handled? Are they investigated thoroughly and analyzed objectively?**

**After just two years as a correctional deputy, Lubrin had at least two excessive force complaints filed against him. These complaints were likely generated by inmates and/or their family members.**

**What were the outcomes of these complaints? Was Lubrin disciplined? We don't know the answers to any of these questions. We only know what the sheriff's office chooses to tell us, which is very little.**

**Indeed, all that the sheriff's office provides is this, from its website: "DOC Internal Affairs is responsible for investigating complaints. The unit can be reached directly at (408) 299-2600."**

**In 2013, Lubrin earned \$110,118 (total pay and benefits); in 2014, he earned a whopping \$192,818, according to the website Transparent California. In 2014, co-defendants Farris and Rodriguez, hired one year after Lubrin, received total pay, respectively, of \$134,557 and \$132,169. Not bad for a job that requires only a high school diploma or a GED.**

**Despite the fact that these generous salaries are funded entirely by taxpayers, we are kept in the dark about the department's complaint process.**

**According to the DOC's website, its mission is "to serve and protect the citizens of Santa Clara County and the state of California, by detaining the people under its supervision in a safe and secure environment, while providing for their humane care, custody and control."**

**We know that Tyree was not provided a safe, secure or humane environment. Of how many other inmates is this true?**

**The DOC's website also states, "We value public safety and security by providing quality services to the community through accountability, dedication, professionalism, innovation and vision."**

**When correctional deputies police themselves, there is no accountability to the community.**

**Secrecy and darkness are dangerous; they have no place in the DOC or in any other part of the sheriff's office.**

**Because transparency is essential to lawful policing of our streets and our jails, the Board of Supervisors and the sheriff must place independent civilian oversight of the sheriff's office at the top of their list of priorities. If they don't, then the community must do it for them.**

**Bill,**

**Don't know if anything has ever been published in the Farsider about Social Security WEP/GPO. I joined this group to repeal WEP/GPO via the City of San Jose Retirees' website.**

**What happens is when you are eligible for SS benefits, the SS Administration takes into account your City of San Jose pension and reduces your award accordingly. I was suppose to receive approx. \$1100 a month and it was reduced to \$350 due to my "lucrative" City of San Jose and PERS pension benefits.**

**Eight years after I retired I won a \$52,000 award from SSA (Social Security Administration) related to my city disability retirement. That was reduced to \$23,000.**

**My Social Security deductions were from three years in the US Army and 14 years working at San Jose Hospital and other off duty jobs. Two of my friends, a retired San Mateo County Sgt. and a DOD School Administrator, have also been affected. So they will come for you when you apply for your benefits. Another equal distribution move by the Federal Government.**

**This WEP/GPO rule was passed during the Reagan administration, and Senator Feinstein has introduced bills in the past to repeal it with no luck. I feel this group will meet the same end but "nothing ventured, nothing gained."**

When I applied for SSA benefits 14 years ago that coincided with my City retirement, my benefit should have been based on four years active military duty and over 30 years of part-time jobs in which I contributed to FICA taxes. But my benefit was severely reduced because of my City and much smaller PERS pensions. The SSA benefit I receive today is just enough to cover my Medicare payment and pay for a Big Mac. (Let's not talk about the association between Big Macs and Medicare.)***

Sept. 6th

Being a cop is not an easy job. We know this. But there are still some aspects to it that should not be that difficult to execute. Like, for instance, shooting a suspect. It should not take 84 attempts to hit a target. And yet, that's exactly what happened last Friday when NYPD officers got in a gunfight with an attempted murder suspect in Bushwick. As the Huffington Post reports, out of the 84 shots fired at the man, only one actually hit him.

Early that morning, 27-year-old Jerrol Harris ran from the cops after attempting to steal a Brooklyn man's car and shooting him in the arm. Police chased Harris who fired at them with a black .40-caliber Taurus Millennium pistol, according to the New York Times. After 84 shots fired by six different police officers, Harris was finally struck in the calf and brought down.

Harris has 12 prior arrests, including four robberies and gun possession. He's facing several counts of first-degree and second-degree attempted murder, as well as other felony charges.

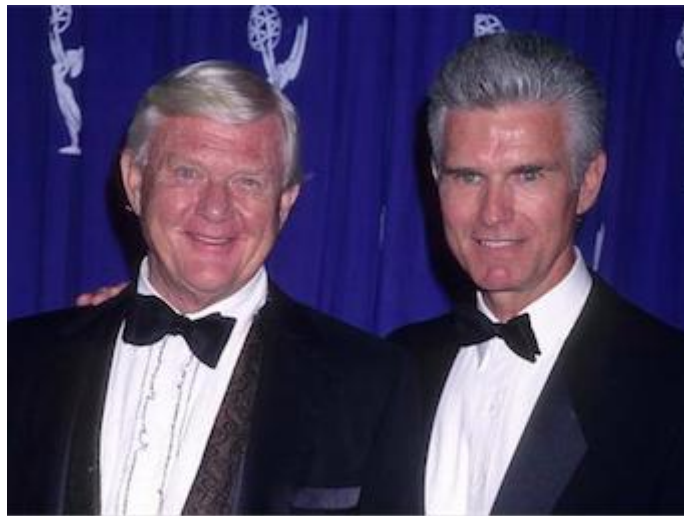

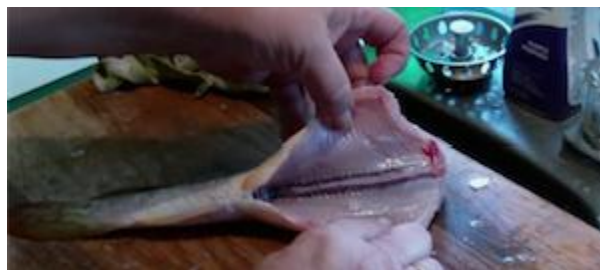
